LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2023 is Boys Town Washington DC's 30th anniversary year! We are celebrating this milestone by reflecting on our history, looking ahead to the future, and recognizing those who have helped us on this 30-year journey.

Boys Town DC opened its doors in October of 1993. In the early '90s, we operated Foster Care, Family Home Residential, and Intervention and Assessment (short term emergency shelter) services.



These programs provided a safe haven for youth who were removed from their families and in need of immediate care. In 2012, we expanded to support families in their homes and in the community through our In-Home Family and Care Coordination services. In 2015, we added Outpatient Behavioral Health services to our continuum to provide an integrated approach to care and treatment.

Now 30 years later, we continue this journey by remaining focused on our mission to change the way America cares for children and families by engaging in work that keeps families together and collaborating with partners to strengthen communities. We are focused on ensuring families have equitable access to resources that will improve health and school outcomes and employment opportunities.

Looking ahead, we are excited about the opportunities to have *a greater impact on this region* by expanding our school base, career readiness, behavioral health, and family engagement services into more counties in Maryland and Virginia.

As I reflect on the work that we are doing, I am reminded that none of this is possible without the *dedication, generosity, and collaboration of our employees, donors, and partners.* Thank you for your selfless and unwavering commitment to children and families. I invite you all to join us in celebrating 30 years of service by participating in the activities and events we have planned throughout the year.

Staff Highlight: Hotline Crisis Counselor Yadelska Wynne

Yadelska Wynne has a long history with Boys Town Washington DC. With a background in education, Yadelska joined her husband, Payton, at Boys Town as Family Teachers. Over the years, the Wynnes served in many roles

and built incredible relationships with the youth and families they served.

Today, Yadelska is a Hotline Crisis Counselor, taking calls from those in distress. She credits her experience working with youth for her ability to help children navigate the difficult situations that life can bring. "It is such a wonderful foundation, the way the behavioral model is taught... you look at people and at life in a whole different way. I love being a crisis counselor. It's a rewarding experience and I enjoy going to work every day."

Yadelska is an essential part of the Boys Town team. She works hard to ensure that the people who reach out to her know they won't have to face their troubles alone. Her dedication to helping others is an inspiration to us all.

Last year, Boys Town National Hotline assisted nearly 2,500 callers from the Washington DC area. Some of the most common issues leading kids to call in are suicidal ideation, anxiety, and depression. The hotline also serves as a valuable resource for parents and caregivers who are struggling with parenting challenges or simply need someone to talk to.
