At Boys Town, we provide an array of life-changing youth care and health care services that meet each child and family exactly where they are, so they get the **right kind** of **care**, at the **right time**, in the **right way**.

Together, we served and impacted nearly 1.000 children in Central Florida.

In-Home Family Services

102 children and 53 families learned how to handle issues after they arise, but also how to prevent them from becoming more disruptive, while they remain in their home.

Boys Town National Hotline®

3,372 calls from Florida were answered and 9 suicides in progress were prevented by our Hotline crisis counselors.

Boys Town Common Sense Parenting®

181 families and caregivers learned **new skills by** building on their parenting strengths and developing healthy relationships with their children.

Family Home Program[™]

35 boys and girls lived in family-style residential

Intervention and Assessment

We **provided care for 99** abused, neglected, runaway and delinquent children of all ages by removing them from dangerous situations, assessing their needs and beginning to work toward family reunification or other permanent care.

Behavioral Health Clinic

331 children and their families who were experiencing any of a wide variety of problems including ADHD, school difficulties, emotional issues, noncompliance and/or relationship concerns found support and guidance.

Behavioral Health Clinic Summer Tips

Happy summer vacation! For kids, summer break is all about relaxation and less-structured schedules. On the other hand, moving away from the school routine can make parents feel a bit more stressed. Here are a couple tips to help you make the most of sweet summertime by getting kids outside more and keeping bedtimes consistent.

» Less screen time and more outdoor time. A great idea



is to have kids earn one minute of screen time for each minute they spend being active outside. This will help motivate your kids to get outside and not spend all day on their screens. Sun exposure earlier in the day promotes better sleep at night.

Remember to send kids out with sun protection, a hydrating beverage and avoid the hottest times of day (12 p.m. – 3 p.m.). Since parents are models for their children, we should also schedule time to be outside with our kids engaged in activities (bird watching, bike rides, neighborhood walks, etc.). Also, you can have your kids read books outside or journal outdoors about their summer day.

» Bedtimes. Just because school is out, does not mean kids should be permitted to stay up super late. It is recommended to keep regular sleep and wake times consistent during the summer months. Encourage your kids to go to bed at the same time and try to wake up at the same time each morning (i.e., hours before noon). Try to stay within an hour of their usual schoolyear bedtime. Give their electronic

hour of their usual schoolyear bedtime. Give their electronic devices a bedtime, too; electronic devices too close to bedtime can make falling asleep particularly difficult. It is recommended that an hour or two before bedtime kids should power down their screens and even turn in their devices to parents to avoid sneaking back on them later at night.

The key is to not stray too far from your schoolyear routine. Keeping some structure in your family life will make for a less stressful summer for you and a more enjoyable one for your kids and family!

At Boys Town, we rely on our Family-Teachers to create a stable, familycentered lifestyle for all of our residential youth. The Family Home Program provides a home for children ages 9 to 17. Six to eight boys or girls live in each single Family Home with a married couple called Family-Teachers. In our homes, youth learn social and independent-living skills that help them find success at home, in school and in their

community. This year, we are honored to announce our

newest Family-Teaching couple: Mike and Joanie Dunn!

Although they are the newest addition to our Boys Town Central Florida campus, Boys Town is not something new to Mike and Joanie. In fact, Boys Town runs in their bloodline. Joanie's father is a proud Boys Town alum and was raised at the main campus in Omaha, NE after his family members passed away in a house fire in 1959... he was only nine years old. He went on to age out of Boys Town at 18, became interested in mechanics and had a career of 35 years with General Motors. It was Joanie's father who inspired Mike and Joanie to come and join Boys Town as Family-Teachers.

The two met in their twenties at a telemarketing office job. Joanie was Mike's supervisor and he fell hard for her. Eventually, after he was promoted several times, they got together and have never looked back. Their love for their work as well as each other grew. While their time in telemarketing was wildly successful, it was never quite fulfilling enough. In 2018, they transitioned from their 25-year careers in telemarketing to focus on mission work. Joanie's passion for travel collided with their commitment

to community service, leading them to Boys Town. Their tenure at Boys Town North Florida has seen them become catalysts for change, impacting over 100 young lives so far. Joanie reflects, "It was faith that brought us here," expressing their unwavering dedication to leaving every place better than they found it, guided by divine timing.
