Did you know that Boys Town also helps girls? On the Demetree Campus in Oviedo, our Residential Home Program, provides homes for youth to stay with us longterm in a family style environment. One of those homes is for our girls. Each home can accommodate up to six youth.

Our girls' home is very special for many reasons, including Mr. and Mrs. Moore, the Family-Teaching couple who live there.

After raising their own grown children, the Moore's left corporate America as they felt called to Boys Town to serve youth in need of a

stable, loving home. Boys Town is fortunate they answered that call more than a year ago!

"As a Family-Teacher, I believe that Boys Town is the place where love truly makes the difference," said Mrs. Moore. "We have a youth who has been in more than 30 placements and she is only 16 years old. Although she continues to display some inappropriate behaviors and ran away in the middle of the night, once she returned home, there was someone waiting for her with open arms to love on her and to help her to trust again. She now realizes there is a place called Boys Town Central Florida that will never give up on her, or any other youth.

Empowering Youth for Better Lives

STAFF SPOTLIGHT

Our Boys Town Behavioral Health Clinic opened in 2012 to serve youth and families in Central Florida. We offer outpatient services for individuals and families from infancy to age 22, who are experiencing social/emotional, academic

and behavioral concerns. Our focus is on Behavioral Pediatrics and we are here to support our colleagues in the pediatric field and local teachers in search of a resource for parents.

Our three clinicians treat a wide range of needs, from young children who are acting out in class to young adults who have suicidal tendencies. One of our clinicians recently partnered with the mother of a 6-year-old who presented with ADHD and aggressive behavior concerns. After working closely with Dr. Nguyen, the family reported great progress and indicated that second grade was off to a great start!

"We've got an amazing teacher, who is a huge advocate for our son," said his mom. "He's coming home with purple (top color) ribbons for his behavior every day. Just yesterday, he earned an eagle feather, the school's on-the-spot



acknowledgment of good behavior, from his PE teacher. Today he was recognized as the Dean's list winner for his class. He has come a long way!"

> The clinic also recently witnessed great success with a young adult who was feeling stressed about school, had no appetite and suffered from frequent stomach aches and insomnia. There also were self-harm behaviors involved.

The client shared, "I went to see a Boys Town clinician who has helped me work through all of these. I cannot imagine where I'd be now without that help. I learned skills to prevent relapse, how to communicate better and to set appropriate boundaries with others. I also continue to be empowered to strengthen my coping mechanisms for dealing with long standing depression and anxiety."

Special thanks to Dr. Amanda Anderson, Dr. Joe Clemens and Dr. Anhthony Nguyen for taking excellent care of our vouth and their families! Welcome to the team Dr. James Nguyen, the clinics second post-doctoral fellow.
