At Boys Town North Florida, we provide an array of life-changing youth care and healthcare services that meet each child and family exactly where they are so they get the **right kind** of **care**, at the **right time**, in the **right way**.

Together, we served and impacted nearly 1.000 children in North Florida.

In-Home Family Services

416 children and 154 families learned how to handle issues and prevent them from becoming more disruptive in the home.

Care Coordination Services

199 children and 90 families received intensive, family-centered case management services to help them navigate through complex systems such as the mental health care system, school systems and available community resources.

Boys Town National Hotline

2,887 calls from Florida were answered and 3 suicides in progress were prevented by our Boys Town National Hotline Crisis Counselors.

Boys Town Common Sense Parenting

111 families and caregivers learned **new skills by** building on their parenting strengths and developing healthy relationships with their children.

Family Home Program

52 boys and girls lived in family-style residential homes learning social and independent living skills to help them on a path to success.

Foster Family Services

Foster Parents, trained and supported by Boys Town, opened their homes to 24 children with behavioral. medical or emotional needs who needed a safe place to live.

Mildred Bryant Adoption Story

For over a decade, Mildred Bryant has been a steadfast advocate for children in need, providing a safe and loving home as a licensed foster parent. Since 2021, she has partnered with Boys Town North Florida's Foster Family Services program as a Therapeutic Foster Parent, opening her heart and home to eight children over the years.

Fostering has always been a calling for Mildred. She attributes her dedication to her deeply rooted desire to help others, saying "I've always had a heart for caring and supporting those in need." When asked what advice she would offer to those considering fostering, she emphasized the importance of community. "Relying on other parents, foster families, teachers and loved ones is crucial. No one fosters alone — you need support."

Mildred credits Boys Town's training and resources with transforming both her approach to parenting and the lives of the children she fosters. She shared that what may seem like negative behavior is often a child's way of expressing unmet needs or trauma. Through extensive training, she has gained valuable skills in effective communication, understanding trauma responses and tailoring care to each child's unique developmental needs. These strategies, she explains, are essential to fostering success.

One of the most defining moments of her journey came this year. Since May 2023, Mildred has been fostering a young boy, and in March 2025, she finalized his adoption! Reflecting on the experience, she shared, "I want every child to feel safe. Fostering is incredibly rewarding, but it also requires deep self-awareness. We all have something to heal from, and that motivates me to provide a space where children can find peace. Learning new skills and strategies through Boys Town helps me ensure that my home remains a place of healing."

Boys Town North Florida proudly congratulates the Bryant family on this incredible milestone. Foster Family Services remains committed to partnering with the Tallahassee community to ensure children have safe, loving homes where they can thrive.

Boys Town North Florida Youth Lead Black History Month Celebration



Boys Town North Florida's Family Home Program hosted a vibrant Black History Month celebration that brought the entire campus together. The day was not only a celebration of history and culture,

but also a heartfelt tribute from the kids to Executive Director Marcus Lampkin, honoring his leadership and the impact he's had on their lives.

The celebration began with the inaugural Marcus Lampkin Black History Month Yard Golf Tournament — an idea the youth developed and organized themselves. Played

across a nine-hole course on campus, the tournament highlighted trailblazing Black golfers at each hole, including Charlie Sifford, the first African American to play on the PGA

Tour and a World Golf Hall of Fame inductee. Naming the event after Marcus was the kids' personal way of recognizing his leadership and support.

The festivities continued with card games, football and a lively fish fry prepared by Family-Teacher Mr. Longley. Staff contributed homemade sides and desserts, while the youth created a playlist filled with uplifting, culturally relevant music. A Pan-African flag — designed and proudly displayed

by the kids — added another meaningful touch to the day.

A highlight of the celebration was the ART Town gallery, featuring original artwork from Boys Town youth and staff. The collection reflected themes of history, identity and resilience, offering powerful expressions in honor of Black History Month.



In the spirit of Father Flanagan's belief in equality and belonging, this celebration reflected the heart of Boys Town: young people lifting one another up, creating joyful moments and honoring

those who support them with love, unity and pride.

















Boys Town North Florida Welcomes Florida State University Jazz Ensemble



Boys Town North Florida celebrated the start of Black History Month by welcoming Florida State University's Jazz Ensemble to campus. The event

was designed to expose youth to jazz, a music genre that originated in the African American communities in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. The jazz quintet educated Boys Town youth about how jazz originated from blues and made ties to how the music influences contemporary artists of today. Youth were treated to pieces by notable jazz musicians like Louis Armstrong and Miles Davis. Lawrence Turner, Florida State student and jazz musician said, "Being at Boys Town to perform means that I am giving back what I've learned. As a young person, listening to other people inspired me to become better at my instrument. I'm very glad to give back to people who deserve it. The youth had great questions, and I could tell they were really listening."

After the performance, youth and music enthusiasts approached the ensemble for advice on how to improve their musical talent.
