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## HIV Cases That Arrive in the ED and UC Dr. Gandhi

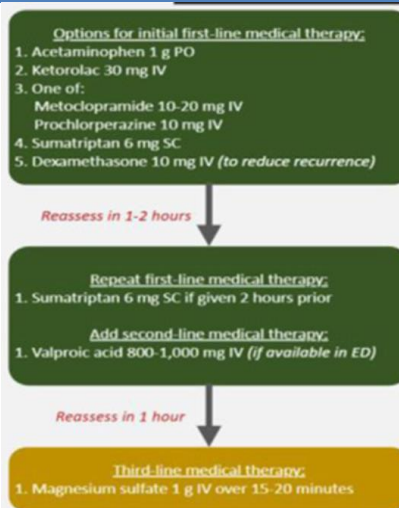
- Long-acting anti-retroviral therapy is a BIG Win!

GEPANTS and DITANS



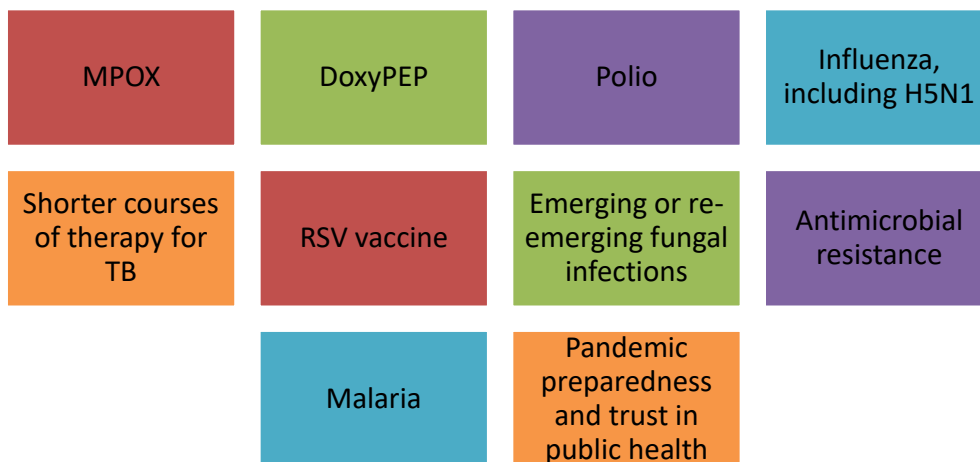
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## Covid-19 Update – A Discussion Dr. Dachs and Dr. Gandhi

- Current status – Snapshot
- Vaccine update – improved outcomes in at risk patients
- Testing – at home, repeat increases sensitivity
- Therapies – antivirals decrease:
  - 1) Hospitalization and death in at-risk patients
  - 2) Decrease duration of symptoms approx. 1 day
- Long Covid –
  - vaccination and antivirals decrease risk

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## Common Eye Emergencies: Dr. Bloch

- Periorbital vs Orbital cellulitis
- Ocular foreign bodies
- Retinal detachment vs. posterior vitreous detachment
- Corneal abrasions vs corneal ulcers
- Herpes simplex keratitis vs. herpes zoster keratitis
- Trauma: orbital floor fx, hyphema, traumatic iritis
- Conjunctivitis
- Chemical burns

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
