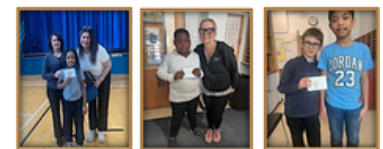
CHOCOLATE BAR FUNDRAISER: A SWEET SUCCESS

NASA Virtual Presentation and Space Exploration Learning

On May 20th, the children in Ms. Karen's, Ms. Shanna's, and Mme Constant's classes had the opportunity to attend an online presentation with NASA Aerospace Educator and Analog Astronaut Diane Carroll Phillips.

The children in all three classes wrote postcards to Ms. Diane while she was training in Utah, USA, at the Mars Desert Research Station, where she became the first Canadian educator and analog astronaut. During her isolated stay at MDRS, the children's cards and beautiful drawings brought her much comfort while she was cut off from the outside world. In their cards, the children asked important questions such as: "What kind of food did you eat on Mars? How do you breathe on Mars? What type of rock samples did you collect?"

The children in these classes were part of an international expedition supporting her mission. Students from Brazil, South Africa, Texas, and a school in Île-Perrot also participated. Ms. Diane encouraged the students to listen to their teachers and work hard to achieve their dreams.

Kindergarten Field Trips: Planetarium and Ecomuseum Adventures

The K5 classes went on a field trip to the Planetarium to further their learning about space, and they will also be taking a trip to the Ecomuseum to learn about animals from Quebec.

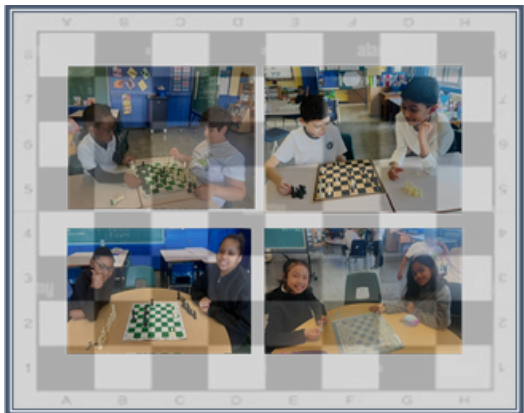
