## End of mask mandate in Quebec high school classes leaves many 'a bit puzzled'

Pediatrician Dr. Olivier Drouin wishes Quebec would have waited to lift the measure, warning the risks could outweigh the benefits.


With COVID-19 vaccination rates high among teenagers across the province, Quebec announced Tuesday high school students will soon no longer need to wear masks while in class.
