
**Course Description:** The Science and Technology (555-444) course will be taught in conjunction with the Environmental (558-404) OPTION course.

In order for a student to be eligible to take Physics and Chemistry in secondary 5 they must successfully complete the Environmental 558-404 OPTION course with a minimum grade of 65%.





