Evaluation Methods

A variety of assessment methods and tools will be utilized throughout the year to identify each child's strengths, interests, and needs to best support their social and academic growth. Teachers will utilize: Brigance Inventory of skills, one-on-one assessments, daily observations, in-class activities, oral presentation, progress reports, report cards, and parent-teacher conferences. Each child will receive a report card in addition to an I.E.P. Students in the Early Stimulation (ES) class will follow the preschool competencies and children in W.I.N.G.S 1 and W.I.N.G.S 2 will receive an numeric report card.

Your child's I.E.P meeting will take place November 27, 2023 (the date of Term 1 Parent-Teacher meeting)
