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COURSE STANDARDS AND PROCEDURES

COURSE: Aim High Culture and Citizenship in Quebec (CCQ)

CLASS RESOURCES: Teacher notes, in-class handouts, online resources, various media texts

COURSE DESCRIPTION: The CCQ course is mainly rooted in the fields of sociology and ethical philosophy. Students will learn to evaluate sources, information and arguments, identify the characteristics of culture and society in Quebec today, and develop critical thinking and structured reflection that caringly and empathetically accounts for how ethical issues affect the lives of individuals.

COMPETENCY 2: Reflects on an ethical question

OBJECTIVES: The Culture and Citizenship in Quebec program is intended to meet three objectives: to prepare the student to exercise citizenship in Quebec society, help students learn to recognize themselves and others, and to pursue the common good. The study of culture and ethical reflection on culture contribute to personal development and equip students to exercise their citizenship, given that they will be asked to engage in dialogue by recognizing the past while looking at how people can live together in the future.
