9. IB Report

- **IB Day:** On September 19th and 20th, we had the IB day. They were all sent to a different time period of time and by solving challenges and tasks, they all got material to build an engine with wheels for the Juniors and a catapult for the Seniors. The engine had to be able to travel or make something fly a certain distance.
- **Classe Rouge:** September 25th to September 27th, 20 secondary 5 students attended Classe Rouge at Camp Jouvence. They participated in many activites such as hébertisme, bow and arrows competition, survie en forêt and canoeing on the Sutton Lake. They even enjoyed campfire with Marshmallow and gosht stories.
- **Terry Fox presentation:** On October 8th all the secondary 1 and 2 students attended a presentation about Terry Fox given by Mr. Monachino. We were lucky to also have parents in the attendance. Students learned about Terry Fox journey and cause. Then students walk around the school track as an homage to Terry Fox cause.
- **Projects in the classroom:** I had fun listening to oral presentation in secondary 1 French class about 'Des Personnages effrayants'. Today I went to the secondar 2 classes in Géographie et Histoire pour voir une première version des projets sur les valeurs humanistes.

10. CLC Report

- **Blanket Exercise** The Blanket Exercise presentation was given to our secondary 4 students at the start of the year. The Blanket Exercise is an interactive educational tool designed to teach the history of colonization in Canada and its impact on Indigenous peoples. It uses participatory methods to raise awareness and understanding of the historical and ongoing relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples. The exercise is a powerful way to engage students emotionally and intellectually,



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helping them understand the profound effects of historical policies and practices on Indigenous communities in Canada.

- **Social Media Challenge** with DOD LMAC has partnered with DOD Basketball to run a social media club that allows students of all ages to research services and resources within the community. Students will then use tools such as Canva, professional cameras (provided by DOD) and more to create social media posts for LMAC's social media channels.
- **Herzl Clinic Presentation** The Herzl Family Clinic gave a presentation to our secondary 2 and 4 students yesterday. They covered a wide range of health topics with a particular focus on mental health and the risks of substance abuse. CJE Service Our local Carrefour Jeunesse Emploi service is back. Our senior students will have the opportunity to book a CV writing session with Monica, a CJE psycho-social worker, every Thursday starting tomorrow.
- **C.A.T Creative Art Therapy** starts again on November 18th until April. There will be a junior and senior group as in previous years (Creative art therapy involves using different forms of art, such as drawing, painting, music, dance, and drama, to help people communicate their feelings and thoughts. It's a way to express things that might be hard to put into words).
- **Girls Group (NAOS Jeunesse)** The girls' group run by NAOS Jeunesse starts again tomorrow. The Naos Jeunesse social worker will facilitate group discussions and workshops once a week with our junior and senior girls (separate groups). Discussion topics will include mental health, relationships, sexuality, self-awareness/expression and more. Workshops will be based on the needs and wants of the participants. Sessions will continue until February.
