Holiday Charity Drive

In the spirit of giving this Holiday season, we encourage our school community to participate in our upcoming Holiday Charity Drive. This year's food drive is a competition between levels. Students are asked to donate food and gain points for their level; by donating change they set back the competing level. Non-perishable food items should be brought to their POP/ERC classes.
