
Welcome & Land Acknowledgment


Moved by Joe Biunno. Seconded by Marissa Papillo. All in favor.

4 Reports:

i. Principal

- Student Population Update (Information Item):
 - a. We have 988 students registered as of September 30th at LBP (this number is about 30 students less than last year)
- Student Council Slate of Projects/Activities (Approval Required)
 - a. Mr. Karpontinis presented the yearly plan for approval.
 - b. Sandra Greco moved the motion to adopt the plan for student council and C. Antonacci seconded the motion. All were in favor. The motion was carried.





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• Representation Fees from Fund 3 (Approval Required):

- a. Request to allow 2\$ per students for representation fees for hosting guests in the school.
- b. Amount would total \$1976.00.
- c. Joe Biunno moved the motion for the student fees of 2\$ and Marissa Papillo seconded the motion. All were in favor. The motion was carried.

• Educational Day Trips (Approval Required):

- a. Request permission from the GB to allow day trips to be approved by the principal for the school year, presented by teachers with an educational purpose to them.
- b. These take place during the regular school day.
- c. They would be brought to GB as information items only.
- d. Sandra Greco moved the motion for the educational day trips and Liliana Zarlenga seconded the motion. All were in favor. The motion was carried.

Mini-day Schedule (Approval Required):

- a. Feedback from students and staff is that the P1-R-P2-P3-P4 model is not conducive for the students. Too long of a stretch for the 3 periods back-to-back.
- b. We are proposing to modify the schedule to allow for P1-P2-R-P3-P4.
- c. New times would swap the Recess with Period 2.
- d. Doesn't affect the student start and end time.
- e. To be included in Parent Newsletters for upcoming mini-days.
- f. C. Antonacci moved the motion for the revised mini-day schedule and Sandra Greco seconded the motion. All were in favor. The motion was carried.

• Educational & Career Fair (Approval Required):


- a. The annual Career Fair taking place on October 20th for our Sec. 5 students at Pius X.

• Car Wash:


 We held an August Car Wash at the Canadian Tire in St-Leonard, proceeds benefitted our leadership program.

- The Student Council Co-op is also responsible for the games in the plaza area which have been truly popular so far. Our refreshed games room and café have also been very popular during lunchtime.

• Orange shirt day:



vi. Teachers


- The common theme is that this year feels normal. Good start to the year.
