# Did you know...

Did you know that Units of Inquiry are a team effort? Specialists like Miss Sabrina, our art teacher, help students make meaningful and relevant connections to specific units. Learning experiences are created by designing activities that pertain to the central idea (big idea) or the lines of inquiry (how we explore the big idea) of the unit. Their expertise enriches units and brings the learning to life.

For example, the unit on how imagination inspires creation, our Grade 1/2M students explored how colors can express emotions through art. They learned that colors can make us feel certain ways—calm, excited, happy, or even brave! To put this into practice, students created their own Color Emotion Wheel. They chose six colors from the board, divided a large circle into six "pizza slices," and filled each slice with lines or shapes that they felt represented the emotion or feeling. It was a wonderful blend of creativity, self-expression, perception, imagination and art concepts!
