- 3. Business Arising from Previous Minutes:
 - 3.1. Major Renovations of Nesbitt School Building:
 - Nicholas R:
 - An architectural firm has been selected and is now in the process of drafting their plans of operations. During March break, they came to the school with representatives from Material Resources Department to look at the school.





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- Doesn't think any renovations will begin before the middle of next year, and even Summer 2023.
- No details yet as to how the renovations will take place. Architects are in the planning stages. The only know detail is that the renovations will take place in multiple phases.
- The first set of renovations (phase 1) will be centered around safety and security (i.e., replacement of the sprinkler system, replacing the fire escape outside the school, Roof replacement, electrical work, tearing down existing walls and erecting new ones).
- No start date available yet, and no date for when this information will be shared to the parents, or if/when parents will be given a platform to express their concerns.
- <u>Maria S</u>:
 - Mr. Cannavino replied to Maris S's email after our February GB meeting. He stated the following:
 - He stated that a project manager had been selected.
 - They were in the process of selecting an architectural firm
 - The renovation project would cost approximately \$7.9 million
 - Work will tentatively begin next Fall (Fall 2022)
 - Plan is not to move the children
 - Renovations will occur in phases
- Maria Lisa D. expressed concerns about possibility of asbestos in the walls and the fact that children and staff would remain in the building. Nicholas R does not have any details and is trying to obtain a town hall meeting with the board and parents, but does not foresee any Q&A sessions any time soon since they are still in the planning stages.
- Maria S. recalls that when they found asbestos inside John F. Kennedy school, the school board had checked all the schools in Montreal for asbestos presence- but the information needs to be validated.
- Martin M had concerns about where the students would be moved if sections of the school were sealed off for renovations and had suggested outdoor mobile classrooms.
- 3.2. Parent Drop-Off and Bus Drop-Off Areas
 - Nicholas R. met with the city and the project manager of the pool project
 - We can't move the buses to 8th avenue just yet because they are still receiving deliveries for renovation work that is being done inside the pool complex (the buses would block the street).
 - However, we can temporarily move the parent drop-offs to 8th avenue (since cars are much smaller, they would not hinder deliveries). Can potentially begin in April and be effective for the remainder of this school year.
 - If this becomes possible, Nicholas R will advise parents- right now it is in discussions.
 - The representatives agree that when deliveries are no longer needed for the pool, we can move the bus drop-offs to the 8th avenue and the parent drop-offs to the 6th avenue.
- 4. New Business
 - 4.1. Approval for Field Trips
 - 4.1.1. Approval for Field Trip to Biodome for Cycle 2
 - Cycle 2 planned field trip to Biodome will occur mid-April to beginning of May
 - Cost is entirely subsidized by the school
 - Will take public transit (as part of the STM program) or private school bus; costs to parents will still be 0\$ regardless of the option.

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- The idea of having Ukrainian refugees attend English schools in Quebec has been requested to the Quebec government. If accepted, can we take them?
- Answer: Yes, if they fall in the Nesbitt Core territory, we will take them in. The school board will need to find the space. Nicholas R. has meeting tomorrow but unsure if this is on the agenda.

7. Varia

- 7.1. Staff Parking
 - Nesbitt staff has grown in past years and they are running into issues with the amount of parking spots available.
 - Winter time is especially problematic as parking spots are reduced due to snow.
 - Nicholas R. asked the school board if possible to move the fence of the interior parking to where the library ends (will take about 15 feet of the asphalt play yard). The board said it was possible and Nicholas R. wanted to address the issue with GB.
 - The modification will help us to gain about 10 parking spots, but in Winter will be less due to the snow.
 - GB agreed with the proposal.
 - Nicholas R. will explore the idea with Material Resources and will come back to GB with a concrete plan and ask for GB approval.
- 7.2. Enrollment Sub-Committee (Pardis Z.)
 - Pardis Z. sent emails to the Daycares that were on her list last year advising them of the open house.
 - The daycare list has been expanded to the Saint-Leonard area for French immersion students.
 - Paper copies have also been dropped off at daycares, grocery stores, etc.
 - The PC meeting has addressed the enrollment issue. Nesbitt was in the positives compared to
 other schools in the EMSB who were in the negative growth.
 - Can we distribute questionnaire to parents of PreK/K asking them how they heard about Nesbitt? (i.e., did they hear about it through their daycares?). If Pardis Z. has postal codes, she can better target her efforts to certain geographical zones. This would help Pardis Z. to evaluate her efforts and to determine which geographical areas she should focus on.
 - Nicholas R. said would be feasible.
