6. Reports

- 6.1. Principal Report
 - Enrollment:
 - 306 students thus far
 - 22 groups
 - An additional closed class was opened for kindergarten
 - Nesbitt School Major Renovations;
 - The floor plan was shown to GB
 - <u>May/June</u> starting the prep work for the renovations on the top floor which is now vacant and not being used at all.
 - <u>Summer</u>: will complete the top floor and repurposing works (ex: the extra space in the library, storage etc., will be repurposed for classrooms, and partitions will be put in the gym in order to have 2 separate gym classes).
 - <u>From September 2023 to August 2024</u>: students will be occupying half of the building, including the 4th floor, while the other half will undergo renovations. On the plan, we will be occupying the green side, while the yellow side will be under construction.
 - <u>When renovations are complete</u>, Nesbitt will be occupying the yellow portion (the side close to Bellechasse) and the purple/white areas. The blue area, which represents 30-35% of the building, will not be occupied by Nesbitt, its purpose is still unknown but for now will remain under Nesbitt's control.
 - A company is coming this week to ensure no air flow will circulate from one side to another and ensure no noise.



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- Nicholas R. will be discussing the functionality of the renovated building with staff; what do we want our new space to look like, what are the needs for each classroom, what do we want the classrooms to look like.
- Discussions on how to divide the space are currently being held; where the office will be, where the classrooms will be, etc.
 - The newly renovated school will have an elevator, becoming an accessible school.
 - The new main entrance will be next to where the daycare entrance currently is and the administration will be where the daycare currently is.
 - New cafeteria will be where our mini gym currently is.

Questions:

When will this information be shared with the parents?

• For now, we only have the floorplans as information but they don't show the division of the spaces. When we have a more concrete idea of the floorplans (around Dec-Jan), we will be able to share this information with parents. Architects are finalizing plans in Jan and then will go to tender.

Is there a contingency plan in place in the event that students and staff can't stay in the building during renovations?

Nicholas R. has a meeting on Friday and will ask.

Are there any plans to beautify the yard?

 Not part of the scope of the project however one of the project managers is discussing with Nicholas R. if there are any ways to obtain funds for this. The school does receive money from the government every year to purchase outdoor games, basketball nets, etc. (smaller items). Cycle 3 and some cycle 2 students are also involved in Project Fusion which is involved in creating an outdoor space and will be working with environmental design artists (to create an outdoor classroom).

If half of the building is being annexed, will Nesbitt be losing any parts of the field?

- During construction: the space on the asphalt will be used for construction vehicles (on Bellechasse side). The field will be available in its entirety, as well as the asphalt on the Rosemount side.
- After construction: it could be that a portion of the yard will be removed if the other side of the building will be another school. It depends on what the other side of the building will be used for. If it will be a school, then yard will be used for that school. If an adult Ed, then they wouldn't need the yard.

What will be done about the lead pipes?


• Nicholas R. will ask the question. If they can be changed, would it be Nesbitt's responsibility or the city?




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Preliminary Floor Plan- During Construction:
