

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL



Students are NEVER allowed to have medication (including cough drops) of any kind in their possession. If your child is required to take medication prescribed by a doctor while at school, a Consent Form signed by the parent must be given to the school secretary. This must be accompanied by the medication in the original **container from the pharmacy (including dispensing label)**, with the doctor's name clearly visible on the label. No medication will be given to a child unless it is prescribed by a doctor. A student is encouraged to wear an allergy belt which holds their EpiPen. If your child has asthma, a pump must be kept at school. The child may not keep it in the school bag.
