Options for daycare as the YMCA is not continuing after this year. Went to the school board to discuss. Will charge \$9.50 per day (both morning and after school), this is less than the YMCA would be charging.

Registration would start at the end of May

12.1. BASE Daycare Presentation and Proposal (25 minutes, Resolution) Teresa Federico presents, from EMSB. Subsidized from the government Also do ped day activities and lunch supervision. More support in class from the BASE workers Any field trips must be presented to the governing board and approved Will start registration in May, can cancel throughout the summer, etc. 5 days notice if change in schedule and will pay just the lunch fees Does this affect current staffing at the school? No, based on enrollment will have a staffing session but could impact the existing lunch monitors Will the classrooms be used? Depends on the school and the needs of the teachers and the enrollment/timing of the needs Can it run at the same time with the ECA (after school)? Yes, will not offer similar activities Same price if you only attend in AM An income tax slip is issued in the payer's name Homework provides tools for assistance, and will oversee. But do not do it for the students.

Marie-Laure Casa-Martin read the BASE Daycare presentation and letter. Joanna explained that after re-evaluating the potential daycare possibilities at Roslyn, she held a meeting with the BASE personnel at the Board, along with Mr. Giannacopoulos. They have agreed to go to the board council to approve opening a BASE Daycare at Roslyn upon consultation with the Roslyn staff council and with approval of the Roslyn Governing Board. Teresa Federico explained how the BASE daycare works and how it can coexist with the HandS ECA Activities.

<u>Kori Betsalel and Marie-Laure Casa-Martin</u> moved that the Governing Board formally request the EMSB open a BASE daycare at Roslyn in August 2025 and that we send a letter to the EMSB immediately. The vote was all in favour.
