## 5. Information and Reports (Student and H&S reps)

### 5.1 Student Life report (Student reps)

- Feb. 17: In collaboration with Carrefour Jeunesse, a workshop was given to students on business plans and sale pitches. Tickets to a rage room were given as prizes.
- Saint-Patrick's Day: Students and teachers wore green. Stickers with clovers were provided to students. A competition of best dressed was held and the winners received a green prize.
- A second workshop on dentistry for secondary four & five students will be held at the end of the month.
- A dance will be held in April (TBC – April 4) for secondary students

### 5.2 RVEHSA report (President M. Rubin)

- Math & Science:
  - On March 20, elementary students in cycle 2 will take part of a paper airplane competition. There are dozens of volunteers and prizes.
  - The next Caribou contest will be April 2
- Staff Appreciation: The event went well. Staff thanked the committee chairs & volunteers. There was lots of engagement with kids to show appreciation.
- Pink Shirt Day: A survey was sent to teachers for feedback. Different activities are planned for the day.
- After School Program (ASP): Term 3 begins on April 2. Some new activities that will be offered are ASL, team-building, and My Green Thumbprint will continue (nature initiative with parent participation).
- Intro/Mini Enrichment Program (EP) for Kindergarten: This will be a 6-week program that begins in the Spring. It is simplified and offers a choice of 1-2 programs.
- Annual General Assembly: The Home & School AGM will be held on April 29. There are bylaws and constitution changes to vote on. One important item is the change to review engagement versus audits which, if approved, would begin in the 2025-2026 academic year.

- MSAC (EMSB Student Advisory Committee): Monthly meetings held at different high schools on a rotational basis. Two students from each school, teachers, and commissioners. This committee participates in a lot of consultation and J. Lalla reports at commissioner meetings. GB should invite these two students to our meetings.
- Bill 21 update: EMSB appealed and won. The government appealed the win and won so this Bill is effective. This item will be discussed at the next council meeting (March 26) to see if EMSB will bring this to the Supreme Court. As of now, approx. 1.5 million dollars have been spent on this and it is probable that a Supreme Court appeal would cost the same amount.
- Bill 96: EMSB legally challenged this bill on its own. Latest directives order the use of
