5.1. Principal reports

5.1.1. Return to in-person update

<u>Silvana Crigna:</u> back to school went well, everybody was happy to be back and usual routine went smoothly. Cold temperature did not allow us to have outside recess or resulted in shorter recess. This might happen in the days to come as well with the projected cold wave. Safety measures are put in place with vigilance by staff and caretakers. Masks are mandatory from grade 1 to 6 at all times and for staff. Guidelines received from the school board were passed on to parents in case of Covid positive cases or symptoms for students or household members. No general tracking is done except by Principal and Johanne Hall to keep track of cases and/or when students are due back to school.

The school keeps track of all visitors in the building and making sure they are respecting safety measures.

In case of staff absences, substitutes are planned and it will not affect the curriculum

Joseph Lalla: amazing job from the staff and the parents. Nothing to report.

5.3. Regional Delegate's Report

Jennifer Young: the meeting took place last week:

- 1. Chad Leblanc from the school board did a presentation on high school access: 240 status schools are up for renewal. Question arose as to the necessity to have two (2) High Schools with the 240 status in our area. This status isolates a big part of the students from enrolling into schools closer to home. Discussion on the possibility for the 240 status school to become mainstream high school in order to give better access to all students of the community.
- 2. There is discussion about creating a Committee to help school form governing boards as it was brought up that some schools don't have a governing board.
- 3. Better representation for discrimination highlighted

<u>Joseph Lalla:</u> wants to clarify a misunderstanding when we talked about 2 of the 240 status schools located in the west end. The creation of these 2 schools came from parents initiatives. There is not a maximum number set, it depends on the parent's initiative to ask for this status to be given to the schools.

Every 3 years, school must resubmit an educational project to the ministry to have the status renewed.

<u>Cynthia Di Rienzo</u>: virtual learning went really well. We are glad to be back in school for the young kids to be able to socialize with their friends.

Lynn Watson: virtual learning was really positive, attendance was high.
