Fun Facts About the Month of February

- February fluctuates between having 28 & 29 days per year. The 29th day occurs every 4 years during leap years.

Ms Samantha's Mindful Corner

Mindful Corner:

This week, we learned how to pay attention to different emotions— what they look like, and how they feel in the body.

The physical sensations of emotions—heat in the face, tightness, rapid heartbeat—come and go within 90 seconds. Yet, we can be mad for hours at a time because we add to the emotion by returning to the story over and over in our mind.

But if we pay attention to emotions in our body:

- We can notice our chest is tight, our fists are clenched
- Name the emotion: "I'm angry"

And with practice create a small space before we react

You can reinforce this lesson at home by practicing:

• The next time an emotion comes up, you can notice it, label it, and ask them where they feel the emotion in their body. Sometimes we react and notice more negative emotions, but we can pay attention to joy and happiness too!

When you are out in your community, perhaps you and your child can be on the lookout for emotions in others: the librarian, the grocery store cashier, the police officer. What kind of emotions are they showing, and how can you tell?

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Information Pertaining to Second Vaccination Day at St. Monica Wednesday February 23, 2022

Please read through the following information concerning COVID-19 vaccinations being administered at St. Monica on Wednesday February 23, 2022:

- Vaccination campaign will be led by the CIUSSS du Centre-Ouest-de-L'Ile-De-Montreal
- Students will be able to receive their first or second dose of the vaccine
- A new consent form should be completed, signed and returned to the school by
 <u>Wednesday February 9, 2022</u>. Should you wish to withdraw your consent after the consent
 form has been returned, you must contact the school to have it withdrawn. If you change
 your mind afterwards, you will be responsible for bringing your child to a mass vaccination
 site.
- In addition to filling out the paper copy of the consent form, you must also register on the government registration site *clients3.clicsante.ca/67014/take-appt*This second step is required so that your child is registered in the government's database. Take note that the online registration site will ask you to choose a time. This choice is not the time that your child will be vaccinated at school, they will be creating an in-house schedule. You will need to choose any time so that you can move forward with the registration.
- For children who were infected recently with COVID-19, we will respect the recommendation of the Quebec Immunization Program to delay the first or second dose until at least 8 weeks from the date of the positive test result. If you still wish to have your child vaccinated, you will need to sign the vaccination consent form sent to you by the school to request vaccination at a minimum of 21 days after a positive test result or the appearance of symptoms. The nurse at the vaccination clinic will evaluate the request and will decide based on their clinical judgement.
- If your child turned 12 after they received their first dose, they will be given an adult dose of the vaccine for the second as per the Quebec Immunization Program's protocol.


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


