#### **6.1. Principal's Report**

##### **• December & January Events**

- The breakfast with Santa event in December was a huge success because of the efforts of the teams at Breakfast Club and the Generations Foundation; Val for decorations and the whole team.
- A new TV is installed in the foyer. It's used to announce events and to recognize accomplishments.
- Last Friday, Grade 6 students went to Rosemount High School for a kick-off for the month of Music (January) to perform Ode to Joy. Ms. Allison and the students did a phenomenal job representing our school and community.
- Later in January, we'll be hosting an open house and a literacy evening. It is a strategic priority for our education plan to invite existing parents to share tools and kickstart literacy at home.
- In February, We'll host a series of Wednesday workshops for our Cycle 2 students, organized by This360. The workshops will focus on social-emotional tools.

##### **• Update to code of conduct**

- Revamping the look of it to make things easier to find.
- Will be presented at the next governing board meeting for approval, after it's been presented to the teachers and staff council.

##### **• Trips (Day and overnight)**

- The traditional grade 6 overnight trip is cancelled. It requires a classroom teacher to attend for risk and liability reasons, but there are currently no teachers available to go. Grade 6 students to be offered an extended day trip that includes a team-building escape room, a disco boat and a restaurant dinner. Students should return to the school before 6:30 p.m.

##### **• Subject time allocation**

- Starting to look forward to next year's planning and allocating time accordingly to each subject. Some subjects are more flexible than others.
- Currently, the CCQ is being taught in French, but the government requires the content of this course in a student's mother tongue.
- Science and Technology should be taught in French. Currently, we do not have a teacher to teach science in French.

- Dec 5 and Jan 9 meetings
  - December meeting had 2 presentations from the EMSB about indigenous education and literacy programs.
    - One of the programs was called “Biliteracy” where the same literary piece is delivered in English and French for students to connect the languages.
    - The other is about digital literacy where students are challenged to question what they are reading and the content they are being exposed to.
    - Parents requested a dedicated EMSB email address for school governing boards.
      - Mr Mangal pointed out that governing boards should not have their own email addresses, and that all parent concerns should go to either the school’s or the principal’s email address.
    - SPVM provided an Anti-troll kit for anti-bullying tools for parents to have guidance
  - January meeting had 3 key points
    - The budget building process has been delayed but the EMSB will deploy a questionnaire on the spending priorities for the following academic year. The budget has decreased.
    - Draft calendar for the next school year was presented. The first day of school is September 2.
    - EPCA made a call for suggestions of workshop ideas.

  - Grade 6 concert
  - In December, the annual students versus teachers game took place and was a lot of fun. The students kept it close this year but they still didn’t win.
  - Basketball season is on and both boys and girls teams are on a winning streak right now. They will compete at the LCC tournament.
  - Cycle 2 and 3 skating started at Doug Harvey and Bleu Blanc Rouge. The program will continue until February.
  - We applied for a grant for a gym upgrade for glass backboards and it got approved.
