Life during the war


In William's second year of studying architecture at McGill University, he was enlisted into the Royal Canadian Armored Corps (R.C.A.C) military unit and joined Lord Strathcona's Horse army. He also received a commission at Camp Borden, Ontario in January 1943. William Edward Ralston was ranked as a lieutenant, which is a naval officer of high rank. In particular, he was a commissioned officer in the Navy or coast guard ranking above lieutenant junior grade, and below lieutenant commander. As a part of the 2nd armed regiment, he went overseas to Italy. However, on September 23rd, 1944, William Edward Ralston was killed in action, during the war of Ijsselmeer (1944 - 1945). And his brother Herbert James Ralston, a pilot in the R.C.A.F, was killed overseas in 1942.

The army and its legacy

As it is one of the three regular armoured regiments in the Canadian army, Lord Strathcona's Horse (Royal Canadians)(R.C.A.C) was established in 1900 during the Boer War, [the Second South African War between Great Britain and the Afrikaner republics of Transvaal 1899 - 1902]. Since then, the regiment has fought in every Canadian war and has also, negotiated in many peace support operations.

The regiment has been based in Alberta since 1970 and is a part of the first Canadian mechanized brigade.
