Early Life:

John George Redpath was born February 28th, 1923, in Montreal, Quebec. He was the son of Ronald F. Redpath and Kathleen Redpath. John started to attend Westmount High School in 1936. He was on the football team during his fourth year and on both the football and hockey teams during his last year. He wanted to be a brewer and kept his ambitions a secret. He graduated from Westmount in 1941.

War Life/Death


After high school, John George Redpath followed in his father's footsteps and joined the Royal Canadian Air Force. He became a flying officer (a commissioned officer in the British Air Force who ranks with a first lieutenant) with the service number: j/38919. John was accidentally killed during an air collision in Ottawa, Ontario in 1944 at the age of 21. He was buried at Mount-Royal Cemetery, Montreal, Quebec, Canada.
