Toronto and the Downsview Airport Lands have been the home of Indigenous peoples for many thousands of years. Northcrest acknowledges that these lands are the traditional territory of many nations including the Anishinaabeg, the Haudenosaunee, the Huron-Wendat and more recently the Mississaugas of the Credit, who signed Treaty 13 (1805) with the British Crown.

For more than a century, some of the world's most advanced, highest-performing aircraft have been built in Downsview.

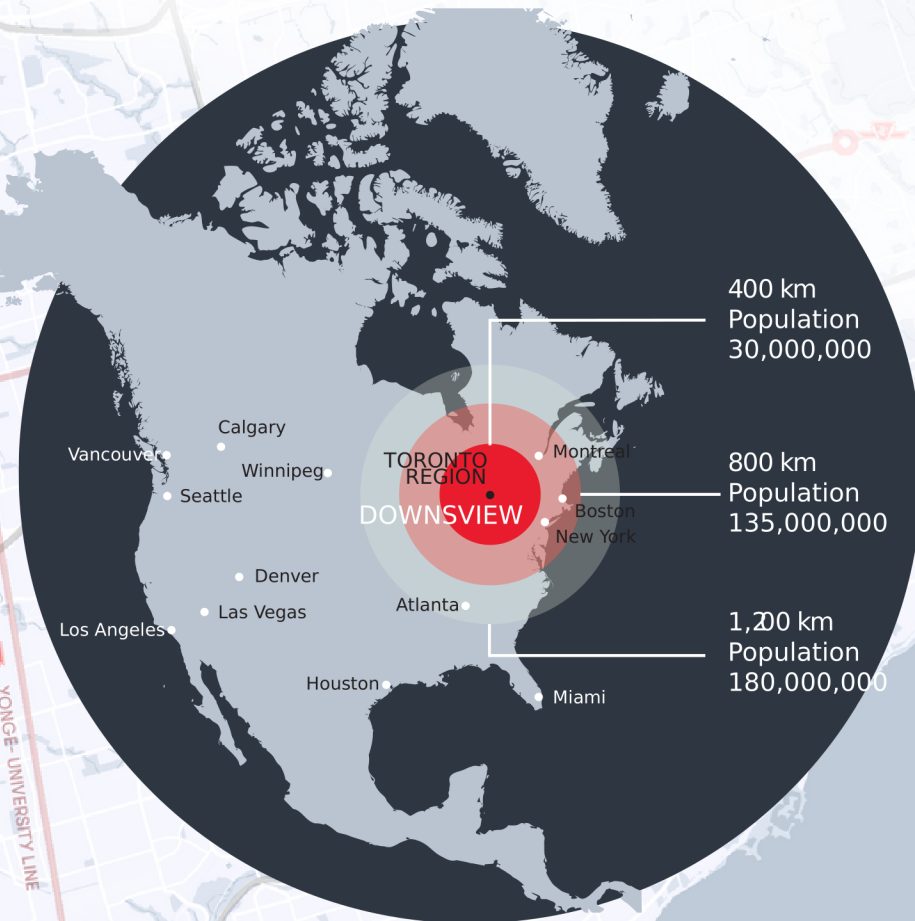
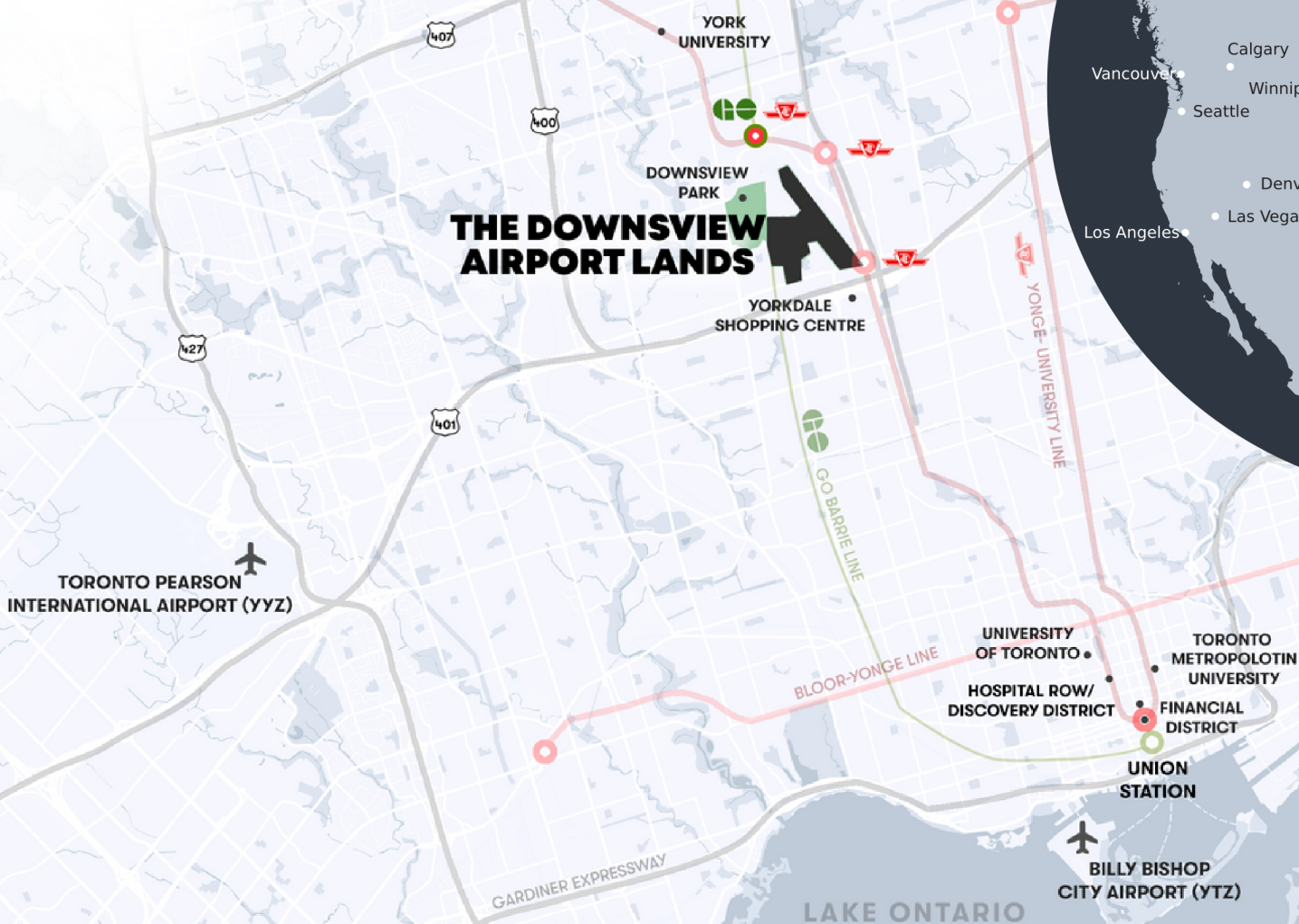
On a rural airstrip in the 1920s, De Havilland Aircraft of Canada Limited began building and testing its aircraft. At the outbreak of World War II, the Canadian government turned the site into a military airbase where the ultra-lightweight Mosquito fighter bomber was manufactured, one of the most advanced warplanes of its time. It was credited for helping turn the tide of the air war in Europe.

Groundbreaking advances in aviation continued at Downsview in the post-war period and in more recent years, Bombardier Aerospace began producing the Global Series business jets on-site. These impressive aircraft fly faster, further and higher than any other planes in their class.

With Bombardier relocating its aerospace operations and the Downsview Airport closing, Northcrest Developments is poised to build on the incredible legacy of innovation.

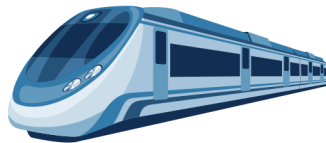
